Committee Terms of Reference and Delegated Powers CURRICULUM and STUDENT AFFAIRS

Terms of Reference

- 1. It is the duty of the Curriculum and Student Affairs Committee to:
 - (a) Oversee and approve all curriculum, pastoral, safeguarding and SEND policies and to bring these to the full Governing Body for adoption;
 - (b) Review all the above policies at appropriate intervals and where necessary update them;
 - (c) Consider curriculum development in the long term and to maintain the overall breadth and quality of the curriculum (with consideration taken of practical and budgetary constraints);
 - (d) Liaise with Governor representatives for SEND, Child Protection, Pupil Premium and Careers
- 2. The Curriculum and Students Affairs Committee will oversee and review all externally assessed academic standards and progress measures annually at KS4 and KS5.
- 3. School Self Evaluation and the School Development Plan will be considered on an annual basis.
- 4. The Committee will consider student well-being, attendance and the quality of the student experience. This will include:
 - (a) The quality of teaching and learning;
 - (b) The quality and success of all academic and pastoral interventions and the impact these have on students.
- 5. The committee will consider well-being, relationships and behaviour management at the school and the impact on students.

Specific Delegated Powers

1. The Chair of the Committee will nominate a Governor to act as part of a student discipline sub-committee when one is required. The nominee will normally be the Chair themselves and two members of the Committee (subject to Governor availability).
