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Dear Parent/Carer

As you are aware, Steve Wilson sent a text last week regarding the 'Advance Information' that was released by exam boards on Monday 7th of February. In this he explained that departments were looking closely at the relevant guidance in each subject. This Advanced information identifies which topics are due to be assessed in the summer GCSE, A' level and AS level exams. In relation to this, the Joint Council for Qualifications have provided an A4 document which I believe summarises the main points well. It is available here: JCQ\_Advance-Information-Student-Guide.pdf

The information differs between every subject; for example, some subjects have had content from the specification removed, other subjects specifically list topics that are on the paper, and others have named the topics that will have a higher number of marks awarded to them.

Students will be working closely with their subject teachers during lessons to make sure that they know the details of the changes and will be able to prepare and revise for the exams appropriately. Each department has reviewed the remaining curriculum time available, to ensure that adequate revision time is given to the topics identified by the exam boards.
