Tips on writing your personal statement:

You only get one chance to make a good impression so make sure you complete your application accurately. Write a clear personal statement which highlights and explains your transferable skills from previous interactions and school experiences. Good skills to highlight include teamwork, leadership, communication skills, time management, independent working, organisation of paperwork and ICT capabilities. Ensure that you also highlight your personal qualities which are essential to being an effective teacher, such as listening, having a love for learning and working with others, as well as patience and dedication. Make sure you demonstrate how you have shown these key skills within your application.

It is essential that your personal statement and application form is completed in detail and is free from spelling or typing errors. Remember first impressions count.
