Tuition Route Info:

Trainees on the non-salaried route will need to pay tuition fees to cover the cost of the course but may be eligible for a tuition fee loan. Tuition fees will vary according to the training provider but the maximum that can be charged is £9250.

Scholarships (up to £30,000) and Bursaries (up to £30,000) are available depending on the class of degree a trainee holds and the specialist subject.
