# **GCSE Results 2019**

Students of all abilities achieved outstanding grades that far exceeded national predictions.

- 84% of all grades across all subjects were the 9 4 grades (equivalent to the old A\*- C grades) and over 27% were 9 7 (equivalent to the old A\*/A).
- 82% of students achieved 4+ in both English and Maths.
- There were a staggering 167 grade 9s which is a higher grade than the old A\*.
- 88% of students achieved 9 4 grades in English, with over 75% achieving grade 5 or higher.
- 88% of students achieved 9 4 grades in Maths with 69% achieving grade 5 or higher.
- 83% of students achieved 9 4 grades in at least two GCSE Science qualifications.

Mr Wilson said: "These results reflect the hard work of our students alongside our incredibly committed staff. Students should be proud of their results. They absolutely deserve this success. Well done ."

# A Level Results 2019

Whitley Bay High School Sixth Form students celebrate record-breaking results yet again!

- 60% of all grades were A\*- B.
- 85% of all grades were A\*- C.

The average A Level grade was a B.
61 students achieved at least the ABB grades needed to go to top universities.
31 students achieved 3 or more A\*/A grades.
