Curriculum

English - Students will be starting to prepare for their trial exams. They will be studying English Language paper Two 'Viewpoints and Perspectives' and then revising Literature Paper Two focusing on 'An Inspector Calls' and poetry from the Power and Conflict anthology.

Maths Foundation tier - Students will be studying Pythagoras, Trigonometry in right angles triangles, Compound Percentages, Proportion and Quadratic Graphs and Vectors. Higher tier - Students will be studying 3D Pythagoras and Trigonometry in right angles triangles, Proportion, Inequalities, Vectors, Algebraic Fractions, Rates of Change and Circle Theorems.

Science - Biology - Sixth Topic: Genetics and Inheritance, followed by the final topic: Ecology. **Chemistry** - Topic 9: Chemistry of the Atmosphere, then Topic 8 Chemical Analysis before finishing with Topic 10 using resources. **Physics** - Forces then Electromagnetism.

Applied Studies - Photography - completing coursework portfolio ahead of exam preparation. Media - website creation and reflection considering the views of target audiences. Sport, Health & Fitness - practical development of skills within a range of sports and completion of coursework portfolio two.

Art -Students will produce 2 artist copies and 4 developmental pieces before Easter.

Art & Design Textiles - Students are completing their coursework this term.

Business - Students will complete a marketing project before preparation for their trial exam begins. They will then start the final unit of the course focused around business finance.

Child Development - Students will continue to complete 3 focused tasks as part of their coursework. Students will then be preparing for the final exam.

Computer Science - Students will be looking at sort and search algorithms. We will then start to look at computer hardware, primary and secondary storage, and the workings of the CPU.

DT - Students will move on to manufacturing their products for the non-examined assessment part of the GCSE.

Drama - Students will be revising Component 3 set text, DNA. They will also be rehearsing Component 2, Text in Performance, in preparation for their acting exam in March.

Food Technology - Students will complete coursework based on the theme of Valentine's Day.

French - Healthy Lifestyles, Family, Technology, Exam practice and support for the speaking paper. **German** - Social Issues, The Environment, Healthy Lifestyles, Family, Technology, Exam practice and support for the speaking paper.

Geography - Students will be studying The Living World, Ecosystems - Tropical Rainforests and Cold Environments.

Health and Social Care - Students are completing their third, and final piece of coursework on creative activities.

History - Students will be studying Power and the People from 1170 to the present day.

IT (CIDA) - Students will be producing attention grabbing web products using web authoring software, multimedia assets and navigation features.

Music - Students will record ensemble performances, refine compositions and revise the 8 set works for the written paper.

PE GCSE - Students will begin to study Socio Cultural Issues in Sport for Paper 2 exam. Students are also starting the written coursework module. PE (OCR Cambridge National Sports Studies Level 2) - Students are now working on the exam
