# JUBJECT RECAP

**ENGLISH** - Students are working on exploring the Sci-Fi genre and covering a range of reading and writing tasks. Also building towards a speaking and listening presentation where they pitch to Netflix, outlining their plan for a sci-fi film which dramatises an issue facing society.

MATHS - Students are building on topics they have studied throughout Y9 by completing some investigations and problem solving activities.

**CIENCE** - **BIOLOGY**: Focus continues on plants, investigating their structure and function. Linking learning of plants to photosynthesis and plant reproduction. **CHEMISTRY**: Students are studying chemistry of the environment, learning about the greenhouse effect and climate change, and how certain materials such as fossil fuels and plastic can have detrimental effects on the planet.

**PHYSICS**: Students have been studying the topic of waves, focussing on light and sound. This includes practical work on reflection and refraction and measuring the speed of sound.

**ART** - Students are completing oil pastel portraits, focussing on tone and texture. Some will go on to create a GCSE ready project and students who have opted to do art at GCSE next year have been invited to an oil painting club to develop their skills.

DT - Students have been finishing practical work and have moved on to some creative designing using software like SketchUp or preparing a new Google 'doodle'. Robotics - After completing their practice tasks, all of the students are now fully engaged in making their real robot. Jewellery - Students are completing a pewter casting project, inspired by the work of Charles Rennie Mackintosh.

DRAMA - Students have been studying Verbatim Theatre, which is a form of documentary theatre based on the spoken words of real people. Students are creating a piece of theatre from news stories, using the drama techniques we have learned this vear.

FOOD **TEXTILES TECHNOLOGY** - In Textiles students have been making their fabric bags. They have made a great start with some amazing fabric painting. We can't wait to see the finished bags! In Food students have been learning about healthy eating and developing their food practical skills.

FRENCH, GERMAN AND /PANISH - French - Focus on Euro 2022 women's football and The Tour de France, alongside school, holidays and activities in the past tense in time for the summer. German - Students are doing a module on "holidays" and "school" and learning to tell the time in German. Spanish - Students have been completing the final topic of holidays.

**GEOGRAPHY** - Students have been developing their geographical skills, they have been putting to use their map reading skills in lessons, we will move onto an indepth study of Japan.

HISTORY - Students have been learning about the causes and key events of the Cold War between the two superpowers, the USA and the USSR.

LEV - In our lessons for Life, Equality and Values, students have continued to work through the topic rotations and focused on one of the four key areas of computing, relationships and wellbeing, beliefs, or citizenship.

**MUSIC** - Students have been learning about the different parts of a pop song (chords, bass, melody etc.) and have been putting together their own ensemble performances.

**PE (CORE)** - Students are participating in a range of summer sports including athletics, tennis, cricket and rounders with the focus of leadership and competition. **PE (EXTR4)** - Students continue to participate in a range of GCSE sports to develop theirskill and performance level.
